Do you use American Sign Language?

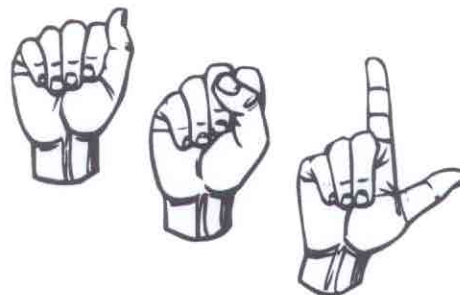
If you do, then you can join our research study!

We're psychologists at the **University of California at Davis** and we want to learn about differences in how Deaf and hearing people use ASL.

What it takes to participate

You can join in this study if you:

- Are deaf
- Are a strong signer of ASL
- Have normal or corrected-to-normal vision
- Are between the ages of 18 and 50 years old



What you will be asked to do

You'll look at ASL signs, gestures, or objects on a computer screen and do things like:

- Decide which signs are real and which signs are fake
- Repeat the sign or gestures you see a person make
- Sign the names of objects
- And more!

It's pretty easy and it's fun. We may also ask if we may videotape your session for research purposes.

How much time it takes

These experiments take about an hour to complete.

It pays to volunteer

You'll get \$10 for participating and if you decide to quit at anytime, you'll still get paid!
